## The Course

Access to Higher Education courses are designed to prepare students aged 19+ for a degree programme. Practical hours are covered at our Equine Centre and students are encouraged to take part in external work experience as supplementary activities.

## How You're Assessed

You will be assessed through coursework, written assignments and practical assessments.
