The Course

Are you aspiring to join the police force? This course is for you. It features stand-alone units specifically designed to prepare you to progress into the Police. Working alongside Humberside Police, the course has been designed to ensure that you are studyng the more current topics, putting you in the best position to progress into the service, whilst also ensuring you have the relevant knowledge and skills to progress to degree level study should you wish. You will also have the opportunity to work closely with and take part in work experience with the specialist operations unit at Humberside Police, as well as taking part in a range of employability workshops with the force throughout the programme. Year 1

Entry Requirements

You will need four GCSEs at grade 4/C or equivalent, preferably including English and Maths, or a relevant BTEC Level 2 qualification. A satisfactory reference is also needed.

Work Experience

Students are expected to find a suitable one-week placement in the public service industry. The college also runs a two-week residential at Strensall Army Barracks.

How You're Assessed

Students are assessed using a variety of methods, including presentations, written reports, role plays, voice recordings, video presentations, practical sessions, observations and posters.
