How will I get to college to enrol?


You'll find out on your Enrolment Day when you'll need to attend.

Lots of support on campus

Cashless campus All our food outlets only take

All our food outlets only take payment by card. If you don't want to use a debit or credit card whilst on campus you can register for a food card.

Our food card system is debitrak. Once you've enrolled you will need to take your Student ID card to the Finance Office to sign up to the scheme. Once your card has been added you'll need to register for an account with debitrak which will allow you to add funds to your card.



Getting to College

Due to our fantastic location we're able to offer our students free parking on campus. However, many of our students choose to use our bus service to get to college. If you are on a full-time college level course then you can access our free transport network.

You can use our handy bus route locator on our website to find the closest bus route, by entering your postcode.



Living on campus

If you're going to be living on campus, we have a fantastic team of wardens who are there to ensure you feel safe and help make you feel at home. They will host a range of activities for you to take part in during Induction Week, with more details being released closer to the time.
